*hàundé = what, à = you, áumàu = doing/making

-I (am) eating gát fátjàu

-I (am) sitting à á:gyà

-I (am) sleeping/laying down à dé:qàu (à = I, dé= sleep/sleepy, qàu = lie/laying)

-I (am) working gat saujejau

What time is it? Háot fáì qáu?

- Háot = how much/how many/where
- fáì = sun
- qáu = lie

What time is it? (short form) Háot qáu?

- It is _____ o'clock. _____ yau fài qáu.
